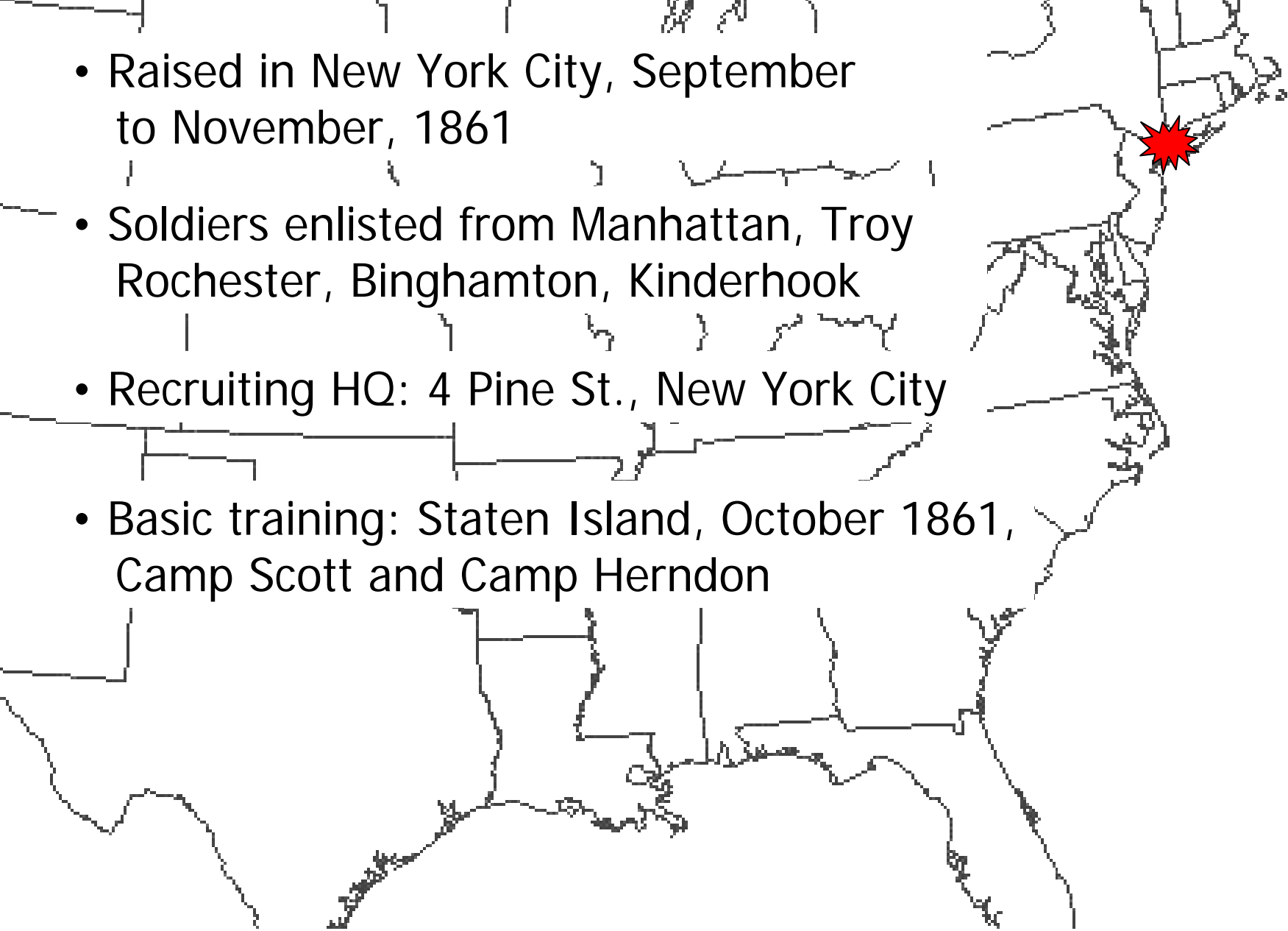

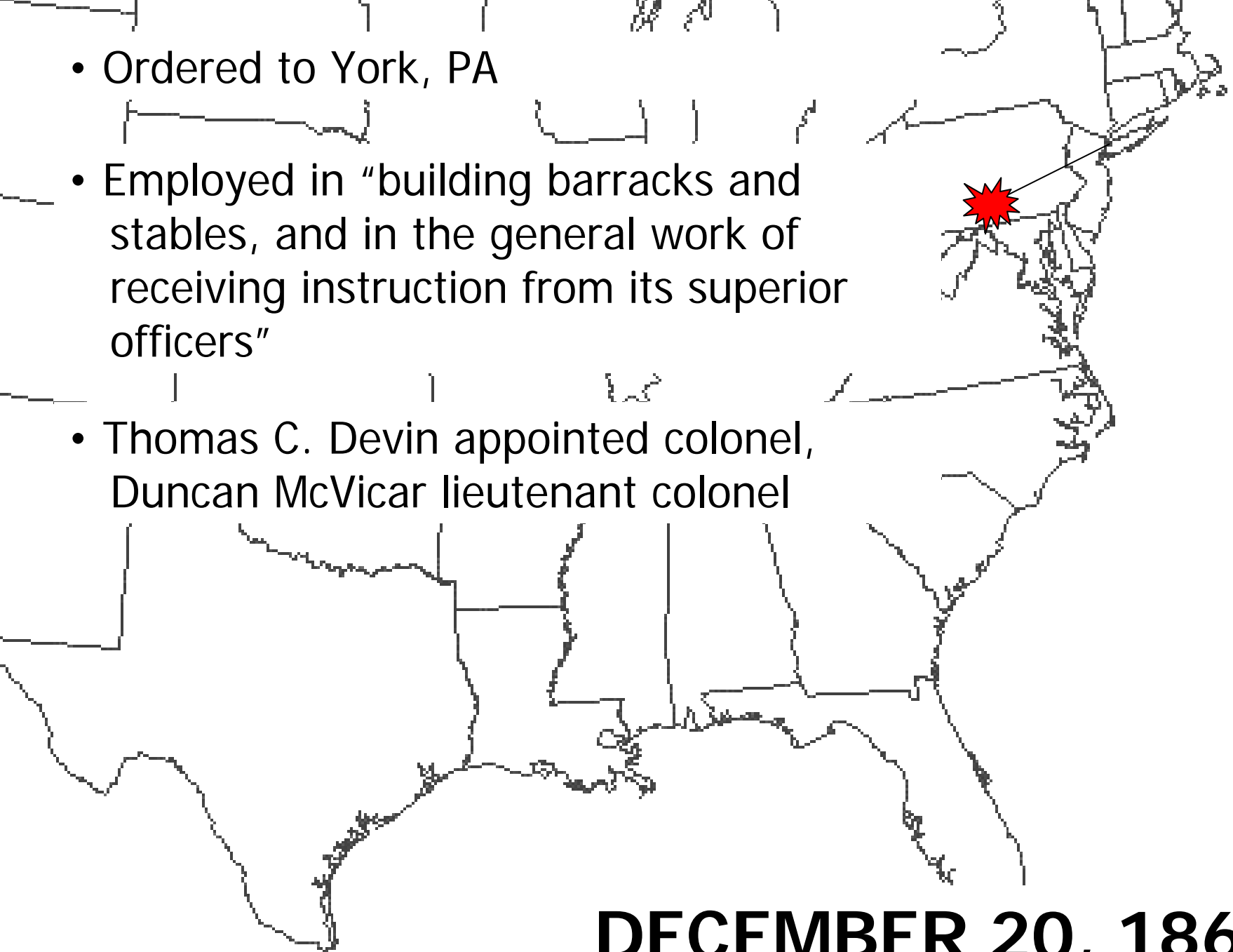


- Raised in New York City, September to November, 1861
- Soldiers enlisted from Manhattan, Troy, Rochester, Binghamton, Kinderhook
- Recruiting HQ: 4 Pine St., New York City
- Basic training: Staten Island, October 1861, Camp Scott and Camp Herndon



**SEPTEMBER-NOVEMBER, 1861**

- Ordered to York, PA
- Employed in "building barracks and stables, and in the general work of receiving instruction from its superior officers"
- Thomas C. Devin appointed colonel, Duncan McVicar lieutenant colonel



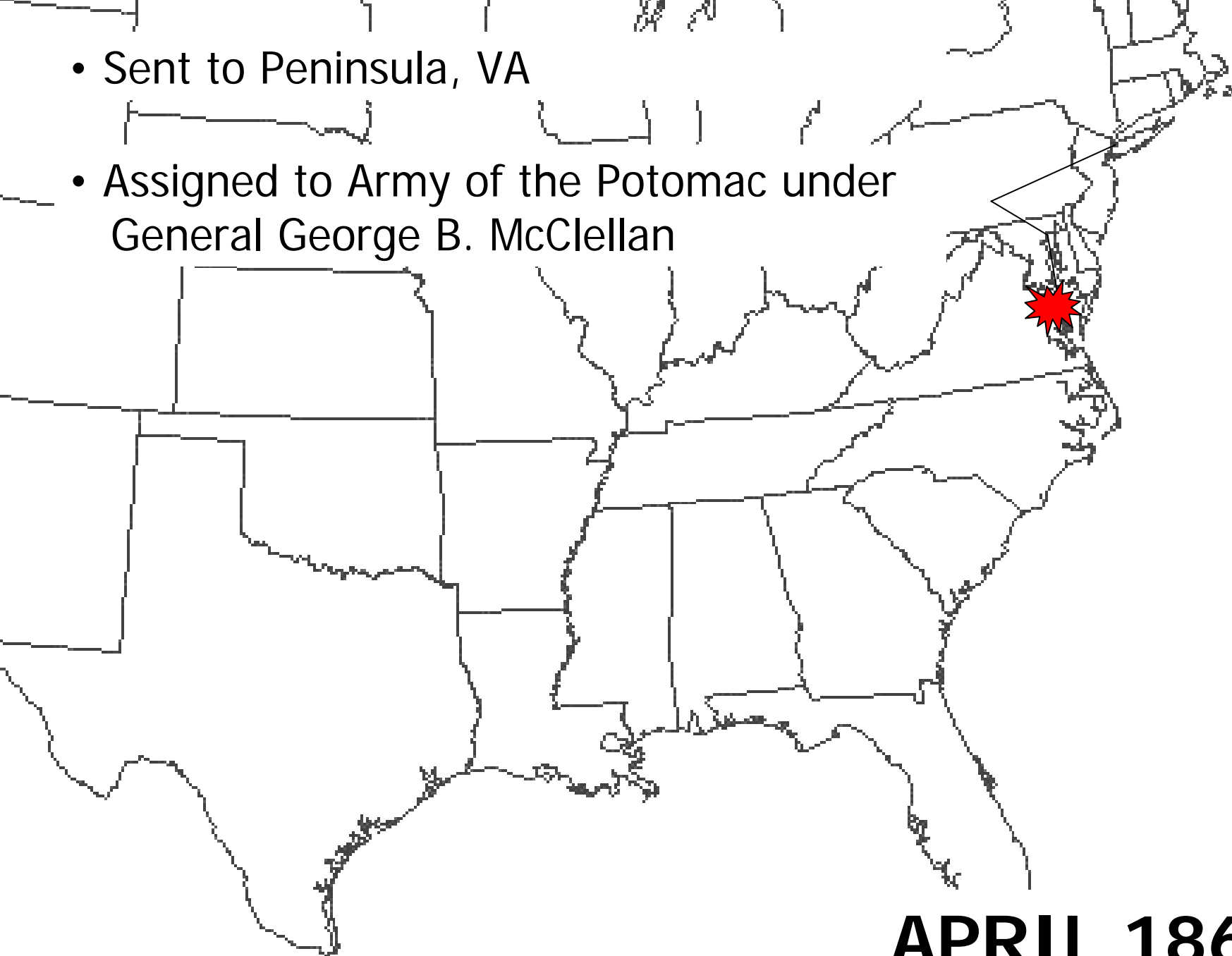
**DECEMBER 20, 1861**

- Assigned to Perryville, MD
- Pressed with guarding the railroad depot and munitions storage



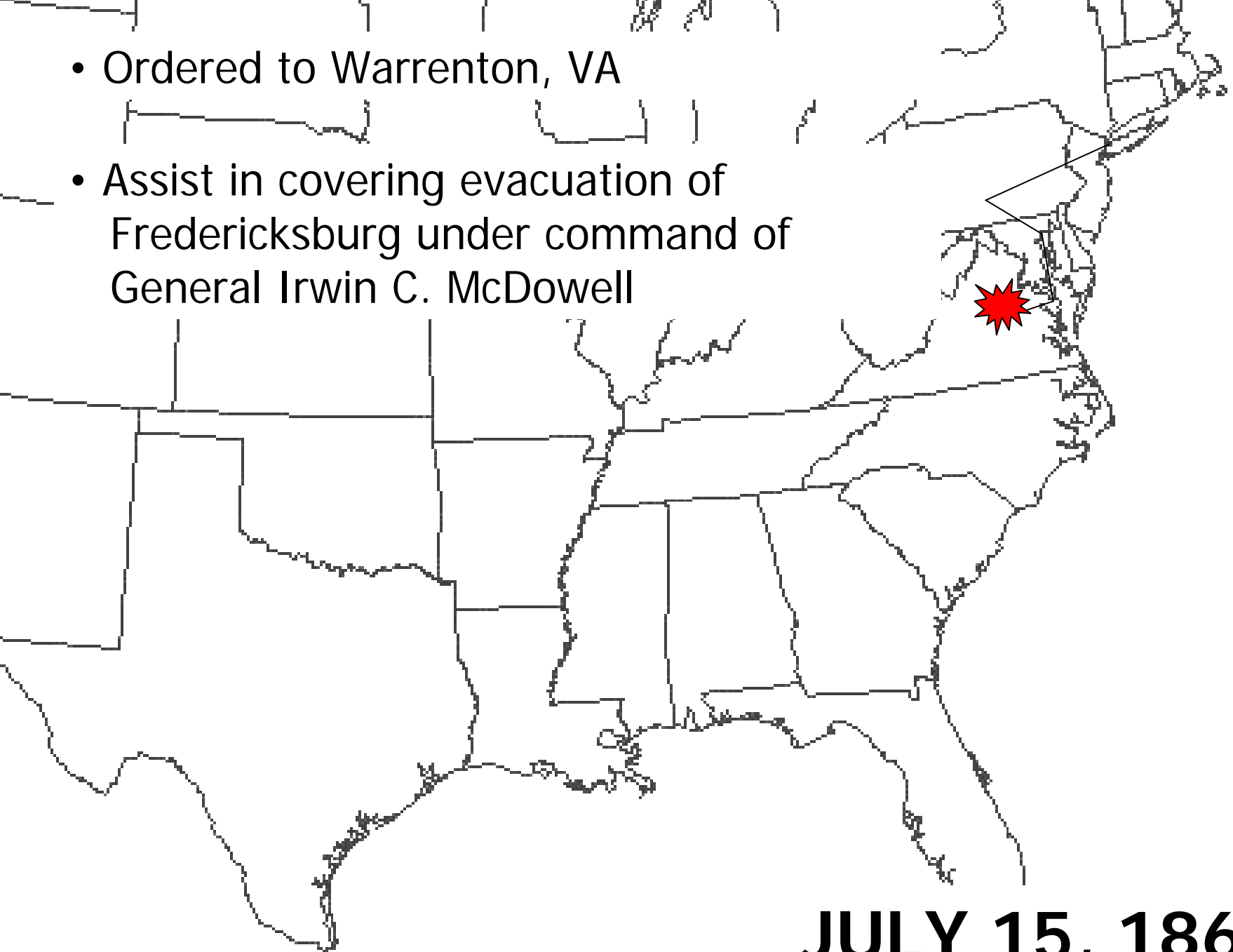
**MARCH 1862**

- Sent to Peninsula, VA
- Assigned to Army of the Potomac under General George B. McClellan



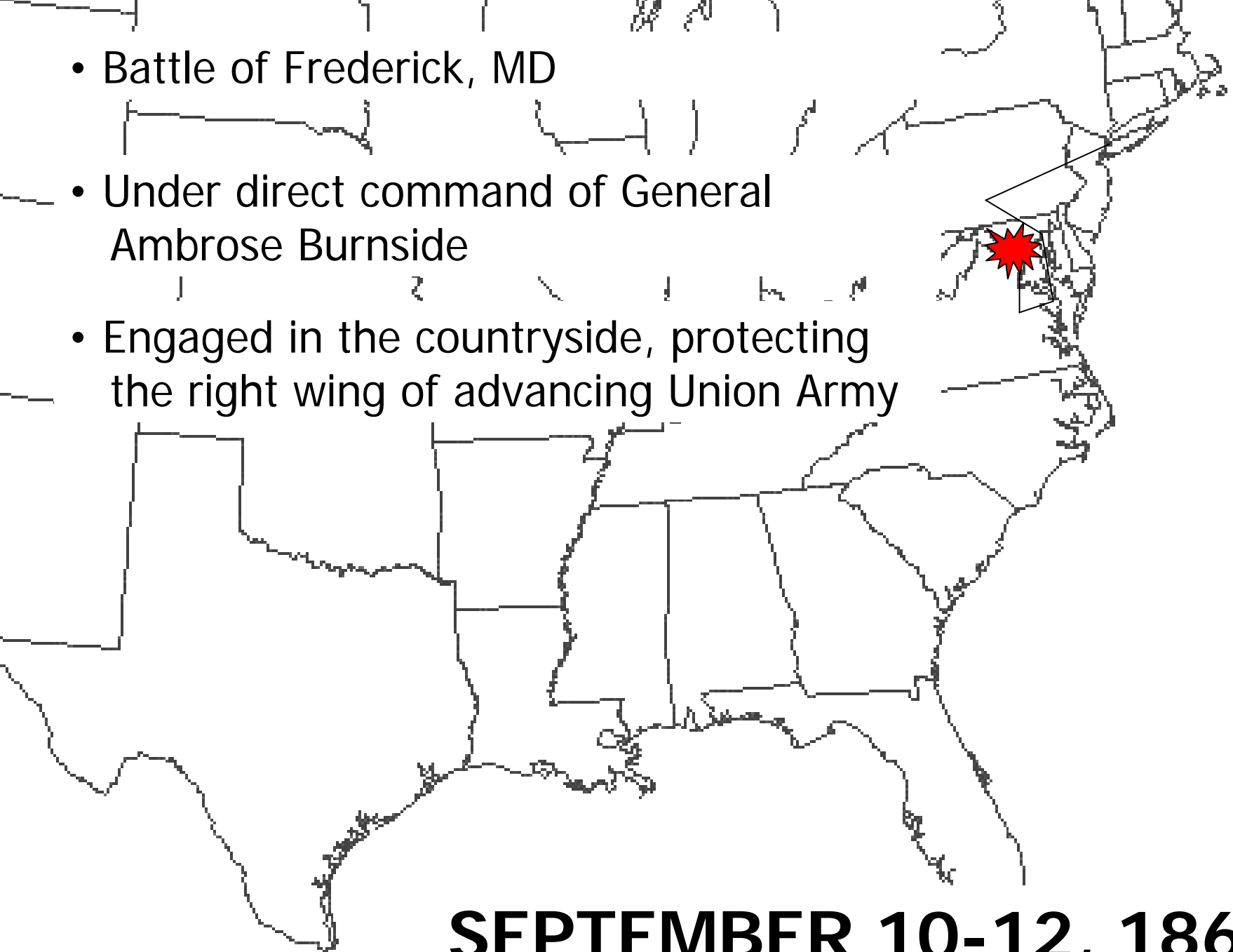
**APRIL 1862**

- Ordered to Warrenton, VA
- Assist in covering evacuation of Fredericksburg under command of General Irwin C. McDowell



**JULY 15, 1862**

- Battle of Frederick, MD
- Under direct command of General Ambrose Burnside
- Engaged in the countryside, protecting the right wing of advancing Union Army



**SEPTEMBER 10-12, 1862**

- Battle of Antietam

- Colonel Devin commands regiment at left of Burnside's troops

- Three of 23,000



**SEPTEMBER 17, 1862**

- Under command of General Sickles
- Battle of Fredericksburg



**DECEMBER 13, 1862**

- Assigned to protect ferry service along Rappahannock River
- Engaged in numerous small skirmishes
- Fought at "First Spotsylvania"
- Lost 51 men, including McVicar
- North to Gettysburg

- First to fire
- Engaged Ewell's advance
- Desperately waiting for reinforcements

## DAY TWO

- Directly engage Longstreet's advance on Little Round Top

- Lee's communication lines
