Here's what you need to know...

1. A big part of this test is matching. You'll match terms, people, places, and events to their respective definitions.
  - a. Seven random matching topics on the test: Edward Braddock, Appalachian Mountains, Albany Conference, protective tariff, Fort Duquesne, Lord Sandwich, John Hancock
2. You need to be able to list some political developments. Be sure to review the Intolerable Acts (1774), the acts of revenue (1764-1765), and the resolutions of the First Continental Conference.
3. Review the images of this unit: the two Boston Massacre illustrations, Penn's treaty with the Indians, the "Rape of Boston" cartoon, Ben Franklin's "Join or Die" cartoon.
4. Actual test question: Who fought on either side of the French and Indian War?
5. You know the Boston Massacre inside and out. Be ready to prove it.
6. Small pox will be on this exam.
7. There will be a series of short essays, and you'll be able to choose which ones you answer. Here are two topics:
  - a. Why was it so important for the Boston Tea Party participants to prevent theft and bodily harm?
  - b. What was it about the Stamp Act that was such a problem? How did it affect different parts of society?
8. An extra-credit question on this test will ask what Logstown is known as today.
