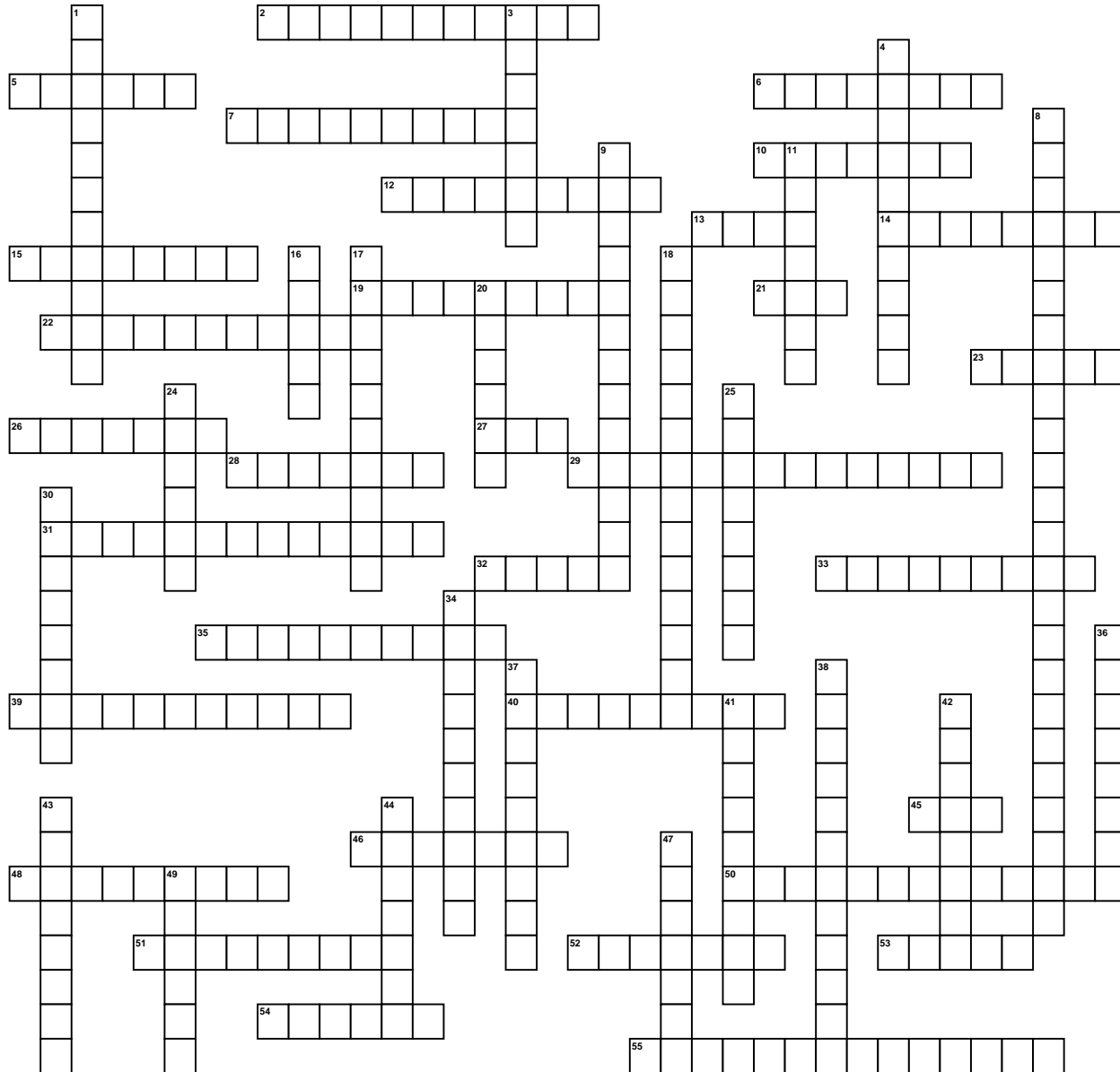

- 16 these committees consist of House and Senate members, working together
- 17 type of temporary committee appointed to resolved differences between House and Senate members regarding pending legislation
- 18 funding set aside for specific purposes
- 20 there are 100 members of this legislative body

- 25 in 2001, he was the only Native American in Congress
