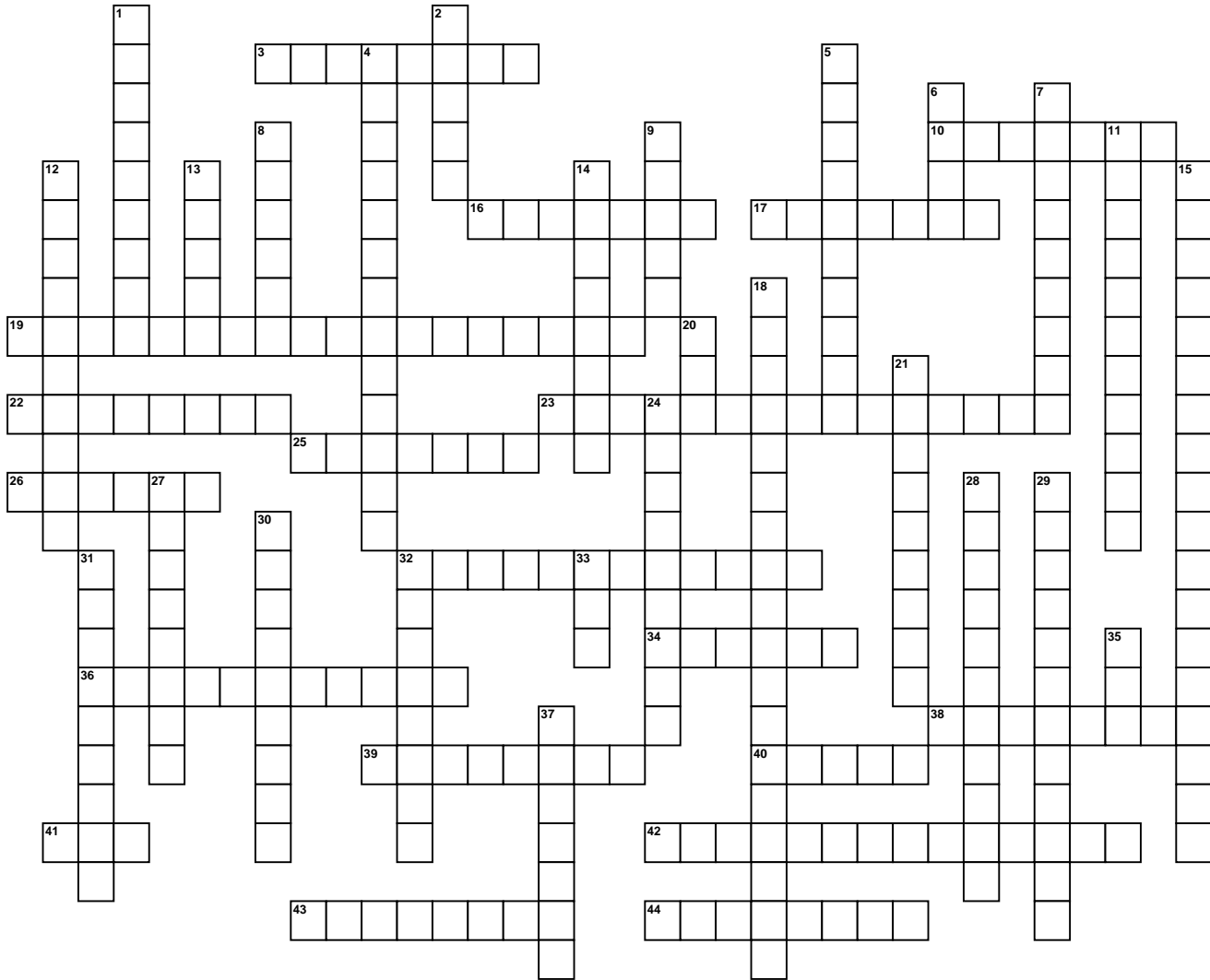

**ACROSS**

- 3 powers that naturally belong to the government of any sovereign nation
- 10 powers not specifically assigned to the government by the Constitution
- 16 lots of these in ANWR
- 17 the judicial branch acts as this between the federal government and that of the states (p. 71)
- 19 agreements between states (two words)
- 22 powers left to the states and the people by Amendments IX and X
- 23 things required of states by the federal government, but not necessarily funded (two words)
- 25 this bay on the Arctic coast hosts Alaska's largest oil reserves
- 26 these powers of congress are specifically prohibited by the Constitution

- 43 this branch of government is given its powers by Article III
- 44 "One of the big guns of federalism", he wrote Federalist No. 28 and shaped our strong national currency system

- 1 Article II expresses the powers of this branch
- 2 this state had been an independent republic for just nine years before its 1845 statehood

- 4 this, in Article I, Section 8, allows congress to make all laws "necessary and proper" (two words)
- 5 when this became a state in 1850, it had only been a U.S. territory for two years
- 6 this section of Article I lists powers denied to the federal government
- 7 federal government gave out \$1.3 billion in natural disaster relief funds to northeastern cities recovering from these
- 8 America's "last frontier"
- 9 this type of grant lets states use federal money in broadly defined areas
- 11 returning a criminal or suspect back the state from which she fled
- 12 in 1992, federal troops helped quell riots in this American city (two words)
- 13 an example of concurrent power is the ability of both states and the federal government to collect these
- 14 the sweater on the dude on page 67 belongs in this decade
- 15 this 1819 Supreme Court decision established the superiority of the federal government
- 18 Constitutional clause that requires states

- to respect other states' laws (four words)
- 20 1970 mandate to lower pollution levels: Clean \_\_\_\_\_ Act
- 21 act that makes a territory a state
- 24 powers specifically assigned to the government by the Constitution
- 27 act that requires territorial governments to create state constitutions as a path to statehood
- 28 a grant designated for a specific project by the federal government
- 29 bombed in 1995, this city was swarmed by federal and local police in the hunt for suspects (two words)
- 30 bills of \_\_\_\_\_ are powers denied by the Constitution
- 31 lower house of German legislature
- 32 Article I expresses powers to this branch of government
- 33 are inherent powers spelled out by the Constitution? Answer in Swedish.
- 35 this section of Article I lists powers denied to state governments
- 37 1862 Act that funded university like Illinois Champaign-Urbana and Penn State
